

The Griffins Head A Countryside Classic

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Nestled in the picturesque Nottinghamshire village of Papplewick, The Griffins Head has long held a high reputation for excellence.

The Griffins Head at Papplewick has just undergone a refurbishment to brighten up and breathe fresh life into the centuries old building, and staff say they hope it will help enhance its already stellar reputation and make it one of the top choices for eating in Nottinghamshire. The gastro pub is a firm favourite with local people, but also attracts hungry folk from further a field and, being ideally situated on Moor Road at the junction of the B683 and B6011, it is an easy place to drop in for some pub grub or stunning restaurant dishes.

The picturesque and beautiful old building is believed to be more than 300 years old and is a listed structure in a conservation area, which, in medieval times, was the southern gateway to Sherwood Forest. Boasting an exterior made for a sunny day, the Griffins Head is surrounded by seating. Pub benches sit out front and a private, quiet rear garden has shaded tables for outside eating with full patio heating to keep diners warm and help keep smokers happy when the nights draw in.
